



The ideal candidate is someone who is successful in his or her profession and is passionate about community service. There may be a few cases in which a day job alone is enough of a qualification, but the county is filled with people who excel from 9 to 5. We're looking for folks whose involvement and commitment goes well beyond what they are paid to do.

Remember, we don't know these nominees, so paint a picture of their involvement, their passion, their commitment and their excellence. This will help us get to know them and understand why they are potential candidates for recognition. The more you can tell us about a person, the better.

Requirements of Honorees:

- Must live/work in Liberty County.
- Must be 45 years of age or under as of March 25, 2021.
- Must be willing to submit a photo, if selected, to be published by the Liberty County Chamber of Commerce and various news outlets as appropriate.

FAQ:

- Can I nominate myself? Yes
- Do multiple nominations help my nominee? Yes, the committee welcomes multiple nominations for a person as long as it is a different perspective from each nominator. Nomination information should not be copied and pasted from one nominator to another nominator.
- Should I include letters of reference with my nomination? No.
- What information is the committee looking for? Please answer the questions thoughtfully and thoroughly.
- Will the nominee be told you nominated them? Yes
- If someone is selected that you nominate can they be disqualified? Yes. The Liberty County Chamber reserves the right to remove nominees for ANY reason, including but not limited to if the nominees can't make themselves available for sufficient time for interviews or if any of the information submitted in the nomination package is found to not be accurate or if employment details change.

Helpful Notes:

- Be sure you know your nominee's correct name and how it is spelled.

- Be sure you know our nominee's correct email address and cell phone number.
- Make sure to address the nominee's professional accomplishments, awards and milestones in the nomination.
- Include as much detail as possible about a nominee's specific professional accomplishments. We're looking for real, tangible results: "She created and implemented a text-to-give campaign resulting in a 20 percent increase in annual giving in 2020." Or, "He raised an additional \$500,000 through our grateful patient program in 2020." Not just "She's a good person who does good things."

Criteria for Honorees:

- Must aspire to uphold the core values of integrity, civility, kindness, respect, sustainability, citizenship and social responsibility.
- Must demonstrate a commitment to maintaining a lifelong relationship with the Liberty County community.
- Must have made an impact in business, research, the arts, leadership, community, educational, and/or philanthropic endeavors.
